*Physical Education Physical Literacy Coach*

### DEAN RUSS

*Coaching & Talent Pathway Manager*

As Coaching & Talent Pathway Manager for Cricket Victoria, Dean's role focuses on recruiting and coaching the next generation of cricketers. Having been a member of the Victorian Bushrangers in 2013/14 coupled with the range of Coaching Positions he has held; Dean is a leader in this space.

Prior to his role within Cricket Victoria, Dean taught Physical Education at both Williamstown High School and held a leading teacher position at Suzanne Corey High School.



### TRAVIS DEAN

*Victorian Cricketer*

Travis is a current member of the Victorian Bushrangers. Travis came to attention playing premier cricket for Footscray-Edgewater, and was one of the competitions top batsmen in the 2014-15 season.

Following these performances, Travis was selected to make his first-class debut for Victoria at age 23, in a day-and-night Sheffield Shield match and created history when he became the first man to score a century in each innings of his Sheffield Shield debut.
