

CRICKET VICTORIA COVID-19 UPDATE #24 (May 14)

QR codes – action required for those using an Application Program Interface (“API”)

Further to the update provided by CV on 26 April (update # 23) regarding the State Government position on QR codes, please note that the State Government has further revised its position which affects those organisations using a previously approved Applications Program Interface “API” to collect check-in details.

“From 28 May 2021, venues and facilities currently using a Victorian Government Application Programming Interface (API) linked digital record keeping system must use the Victorian Government QR Service. For instructions on how to switch, please go to [Register to use the Victorian Government QR Code Service](#).”

Free State Government QR code

All Cricket Clubs and Associations not already using the free State Government QR code check-in system will need to complete the once only, simple and free process to update their QR code. This should be done before your next cricket activity / event.

The State Government Coronavirus website linked below has a simple step by step guide where the club registers for a new QR code and after completing details about the organisation / locations, you can print out a poster containing the new QR code. Once complete, you don’t need to worry about storing / deleting any data captured as it goes directly to the Department for Health.

Please visit <https://www.coronavirus.vic.gov.au/register-to-use-vic-gov-qr-code-service> to register, complete the application process and print out your new posters containing your QR codes. These posters should be on display at your next cricket event / meeting and for all activities moving forward.
