

## CRICKET VICTORIA COVID-19 UPDATE #28 (July 8)

### Current COVID-19 rules and regulations

Further changes have been announced by the State Government with restrictions in metropolitan Melbourne being brought into line with regional Victoria. These changes will be implemented from 11.59PM Thursday 8 July.

Below are the key changes to note from the previous set of restrictions, which come into effect from 11.59PM Thursday 8 July.

- Density quotient of 1 person per 2 sqm applies across all of Victorian community sport when using a COVID Check-in Marshal, otherwise density quotient of 1 person per 4sqm applies. Maximum capacity of 300 people per indoor space and 1,000 people outdoors continues to apply. These are the same rules that applied to regional Victoria during the previous set of restrictions.

A reminder of the other current settings in place across Victoria are summarised below.

Settings	Allowed
Community cricket matches and training	✓
Spectators at cricket matches within venue and capacity limits	✓
Community Facilities e.g. change rooms- subject to density of 1 person per 2sqm (assuming a COVID-19 check-in Marshal is in place)	✓

In addition to the changes from the previous settings, it's important to remember that:

- Whilst there has been changes to restrictions for face coverings in schools and workplaces, face coverings must be worn indoors, including change rooms and club social rooms, and are recommended to be worn outdoors where 1.5 metres physical distancing can't be maintained.
- QR codes remain critical for use by all people attending all cricket activities.
